Writing in Cultural Relevance

In addition to removing language barriers, we're evolving our services for the Hispanic community by offering tailored products, accepting additional forms of ID, and providing resources for financial literacy.



Writing Good Through Higher Education.

Lone Star College, with over 80,000 students each semester, is renowned for providing high-quality, low-cost education for a diverse student body. For two decades Cy-Fair FCU has supported LSC Cy-Fair, contributing to campus beautification, endowing \$53,000 in scholarships to date, installing ATMs, participating in the President's Advisory Council, and sponsoring Cy-Fest. The latest milestone in our long-standing partnership was a 5-year exclusive agreement for a School Spirit Debit Card. Launched alongside LSC Cy-Fair's 20th anniversary, the initial goal of this program is to fund 20 scholarships through the proceeds of signature-based transactions from our new Falcon Card.

Writing Good in Prairie View.

Established in 1937 during the final years of the Great Depression, Prairie View FCU boasts a rich history that predates the Civil Rights Act by twenty-seven years. Its journey began with a commitment to serving the employees of the first statesupported college in Texas for African Americans and the surrounding community. Fast forward to 2022, when PVFCU merged with Cy-Fair FCU, preserving its 85-year legacy and community ties was a priority for both credit unions.

With shared values in education and community, PVFCU and Cy-Fair FCU have embarked on an exciting new chapter. We are actively increasing our engagement with the Prairie View community to contribute to its remarkable story while also elevating our service standards, innovating products, and forming partnerships to enrich lives within the community.

Prairie View FCU Remodel

In 2023, Prairie View FCU launched a modernizing renovation project to offer enriched one-on-one service and increased accessibility. Changes include a new state-of-the-art drivethru experience featuring a video teller for face-to-face interactions, as well as a redesigned lobby that has been carefully curated to combine hospitality, private conversation rooms, and the use of advanced technologies to provide greater opportunities for collaborating with PVFCU members along their financial journey.

Cardholders help generate funds for student scholarships from the proceeds of their purchases. We look forward to finalizing an agreement with PVAMU to create a branded "Panther Card".

Writing Good Into Community Stories.

Our commitment to helping write "good" into the community around us goes beyond banking. It extends to active engagement through volunteerism, sponsorships, and financial education initiatives. This includes contributing food, toys, clothing, donations, and our active involvement to help elevate the well-being of the broader community.



BINGO Fundraiser for CFEF

All proceeds from our event benefited the Cy-Fair Educational Foundation, which provides scholarships to CFISD graduates and staff development programs for educators. This year, we raised over \$6,000 and have cumulatively raised over \$18,000 over the past four years.



CyFair ISD Families in Transition

Donations from CFFCU to CFISD's Families in Transition help provide critical support for students who are facing serious economic hardships to ensure these students have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education.



Boy Scouts Fundraiser

Cy-Fair FCU delivered a fundraiser for our area Boy Scouts, offering to match up to \$2,500 of the funds raised. We were able to generate \$6,400 to provide local area youth the opportunity to join the organization at no cost, who otherwise could not afford to participate.

2023 proved to be an exceptional year with community outreach. We are grateful for our staff and members who share their time, money, and passion to make our community great. Giving back to the community is a vital component of developing positive stories in everyday lives.



Skinner Remodel

Opened in 2008, our Skinner location received award-winning recognition for its innovative design at that time. Five Years, Five Keys

In 2023, we launched a "Five Years, Five Keys" initiative that will propel our next era of significant growth for the credit union. This plan consists of five key growth points that we look forward to maintaining each year. In fact, in our first year since the initiative launched, CFFCU made significant progress in these areas. As we enter into year two of this five-year plan, our objective is to review, evaluate, and adjust where needed to continue to meet established goals. Grants to Support the Community

Cy-Fair FCU is pursuing federal grants designed to help communities in low-income, underserved areas achieve economic revitalization and sustainability. Alongside financial counseling that will be provided, our goal is to help these communities enhance their quality of life.



School Spirit Debit Cards

Cy-Fair FCU is currently expanding our school spirit debit card program for students of collegiate and elementary levels. Through Cy-Fair Federal Credit Union's innovative School Spirit Debit Card initiative, the credit union has given over \$120,000 to CFISD high schools since its inception. Currently, the high school program allocates funds generated by this program towards the support of the booster clubs for athletics, band, drill team, choir, and drama.
